You may be able to sign up for health insurance with a Special Enrollment Period

What is a Special Enrollment Period?

A Special Enrollment Period is a time, other than Open Enrollment, when you can sign up for health insurance through HealthCare.gov. You only get a Special Enrollment Period if you experience a major life change. And you only get 60 days after the life change happens to enroll in a health plan.



Which life changes qualify?



Some of the most common qualifying life changes are:

- Losing your health insurance, such as through a layoff
- Moving to a new zip code or county
- Getting married or divorced
- Having a baby, adopting or becoming a foster parent
- Having a change in immigration status
- Turning 26 and aging off your parents' health insurance
